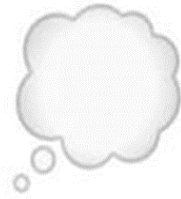

* **Groups, Classes & Events**

Wilsden Village Hall hosts 26 groups which deliver 31 regular sessions each week. These range from dance classes, youth clubs, art classes, taekwondo for toddlers, and yoga through to a luncheon club, uniformed groups and the Wilsden Thursday afternoon group. There is also a library which is open every Tuesday with a wide selection of books for adults and children as well as computers for anyone to use. Recent community events at the hall have included our Club 60 – 100 evenings, theatre productions Happy Jack and The Snow Queen, a Family fun day with Paw Patrol, Count Down to Christmas with Santa and Olaf (not forgetting the donkey!), a Mamma Mia Sing Along night, a Frozen Sing Along afternoon and our famous annual beer & gin festival!!

The new heating system and insulation

Thanks to the ever-vigilant Parish Council representative trustees Wilsden Village Hall was able to make a timely and successful funding application to the Rural Development Programme for England South Pennines Leader fund. An 80% grant of the total cost of £53,189.00, has enabled the village hall to replace the original boilers and radiators (installed in 1976) throughout the hall and also bring the loft insulation up to current specifications. The additional 20% was funded via a loan from the Key Fund and by using some of the funds donated to the village hall 40 Candles appeal (thank you to all those who contributed to the fund).

For those of you with a technical leaning, a tricky element of the new installation was linking the new boilers to the existing pipework. The old system was designed to operate at a lower pressure than the new one. The solution was to install a heat exchange system. This entails operating two closed systems which are linked by a heat exchange plate. The heat transfers from the high-pressure system to the low-pressure system via the plate, heating the water in the low-pressure system.

The new system is zoned enabling the various parts of the hall to be heated or turned off as required and is as you would expect much more efficient. Estimates from Leeds University suggest the hall should be able to save between 25 and 30% of its spend on energy. Whilst also reducing our impact on the environment.

As part of the celebrations, Jane Callaghan of Wilsden Parish council has been asking villagers about memories of what life was like in Wilsden Village during wartime.

Here are a couple of stories she has heard so far about food rationing.....

- * Some of a consignment of discarded chocolate, from Terry's in York, was diverted from its intended use of feeding pigs on a Wilsden Farm and ended up being eaten by the village's children, none of whom seem to have come to any harm.
- * A lady who lived at the bottom of Dolly Hill, near to the fish and chip shop, took a 'chicken' sandwich around to her neighbour to try. It turned out to be a young rook which had fallen out of the trees by the beck. She didn't eat it, even in wartime there are limits!

Jane would love to hear some more memories from people who remember living through the war and has asked villagers to contact her with their stories about what life was like for them and their families.

We would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to Chris Moore for his long service to the Wilsden community in many areas and ventures, in particular as a member of the Board of Trustees for Wilsden Village Hall for over 40 years!!

Chris took the decision to resign at the end of 2019 after being an integral member of the board since the hall opened in 1976. He has undertaken several roles over the years with his last being the Treasurer.

Chris was the Group Scout Leader for both the Cubs and Scouts in the Village for many years. Under his stewardship both groups flourished and many leaders benefitted from his support and wise counsel. Many of the former Cubs and Scouts now reaching middle years speak fondly of their time in the Wilsden Scout Group and the influence that this has had on their future lives. This was in large part due to the stability, leadership and just good common sense Chris provided during those years.

Chris was and continues to be a big fan of the outdoors, a keen caravaner and walker. With others he has made a major contribution in identifying and preserving the many excellent walks that we now enjoy around Wilsden and surrounding area. If you want information about routes and paths, he is your man.

In summary, we'd like to say thank you to Chris for his selfless service, good humour, modesty and basically always being a willing volunteer but never one to seek the limelight.

Chris Moore (pictured left) has kindly provided a statement about his memories of being an integral part of the Wilsden Community.

“Our Village Hall depends on Volunteer Trustees to govern how the Hall is financed and run for the benefit of Wilsdeners in general. As a recently retired Trustee I hope one or more residents will put themselves forward to join the committee to ensure continuity of stewardship.

Back in 1970, an off cum'd 'un of seven years residence with a young family, I joined the embryonic Village Society which published a Plan for Wilsden in 1971. By 1976 after enthusiastic local fund raising by many bold and imaginative members and generous match funding from public authorities we opened the Village Hall. No Facebook then to promote Aire Fairs!

During this period our sons had joined the newly formed Cub Scout Pack meeting at St Matthews, Royd Street; dad was persuaded to join the parents committee and became Chair and later Group Scout Leader. So after brief spells in the Methodist basement and Congregational Sunday School the Scout Group and the Guides moved to the Village Hall basement having made a financial contribution enabling an extension to suit.

The Trust Deed for the Hall specified a Management committee which included a representative for the uniformed youth groups and that is how I became a member o' t' committee.

How times have changed for this independent community registered charity then having a full time professional youth leader / warden/ licensee and substantial annual financial support from the local authority. Today the Hall is a charitable Company Limited by Guarantee, satisfying increased legislation, buying in management services and with essential generous support from the Parish Council.

The hall continues to provide a home for many local voluntary groups and Wilsden Village Nursery School, all contributing to income. It also provides a venue for functions bringing in much needed external income.

Wilsden Village Society revived the village Gala which for many years was based on and run by the Hall. Setting up Friday night, manning stalls on Saturday, Disco dance Saturday Night (fever pitch), clear up Sunday morning; PHEW! What enthusiasm and support! The Gala is now independent but continues its' welcome support when funds allow. Hopefully there will be a resurgent interest in new public local functions which are planned in the Hall”.
